Galaxy Medical College continues to monitor and assess the circumstances and impacts of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) on our students, staff and on institutional operations. Taking into consideration these challenging times, we have executed our Emergency Plan to continue remote education/operation. At this time, due to LA County's "Safer at Home" Order for Control of COVID-19, Galaxy Medical College's campus will be closed beginning March 19, 2020 until April 19, 2020. For this reason, Galaxy Medical College will make changes to how training is being offered temporarily – classes will now be offered online until April 19, 2020. All students will receive an email with directions of how online classes will be held. Students are instructed to follow directions closely to ensure that quality and sound learning experiences are attained. All students will be receiving emails and MUST attend their classes online.

Galaxy Medical College continues to follow its local public health authority's recommendations and orders. The institution will maintain documentation of campus closure.
